Functions of A.E.V. during the war:

To interpret to its members the policies laid down by the Government for the allocation of indigenous and imported crude to refineries and for the manufacture of this material into finished products.

To submit to the Government for approval

- a) plans for the allocation of the available crude,
- b) plans for the general manufacturing programmes based on individual refinery programmes turned in by the members,

To follow up such plans and programmes and report on progress to the Government.

To gather regular returns on production of crude, field and refinery storage, on refinery production and on stocks of half-finished and finished products at the refineries.

To pass on and follow up special instructions of the Government to meet emergency situations in regard to volume or quality requirements in petroleum products.

To carry through or to aid in carrying through instructions of the Government for the development of petroleum products of a new character.

In certain fields of consumption to make forecasts of anticipated requirements.

To make recommendations to the Government in regard to the rationalisation of the petroleum industry.
